1. We have received notice from the Chester County Water Resources Authority ("CCWRA") that they will begin to draw down the water in the sediment pool of the Beaver Creek Flood Control Dam, located in the 400 block of East Reeceville Road, starting Monday, August 24th. This work is expected to last for 1 week. This aspect of the project will be completed this fall, ahead of the planned dam rehabilitation project. We hosted an open house here on July 24th in our meeting room, which provided the opportunity for members of the public to ask questions about this project. The program was well-attended, and Janet Bowers, Executive Director of the CCWRA, thanked us for providing our meeting room for this public awareness session.
2. Hurricane Isais came through our community on Tuesday, August 4th, primarily with flooding rainfall in the morning, and wind that followed in the afternoon. 6^{3/4}" of rainfall fell in approximately a 5-to-6 hour period, the equivalent of greater than a 500-year storm. Flooded roadways in the normal locations occurred, and left some remnants of debris when the water receded. The winds brought down several trees, with some locations entangled with utility lines. Our Public Works staff had all Township roadways open by late Thursday evening, once PECO removed their wires from those locations. Electricity remained on in much of the Township throughout the storm, then failed on Wednesday afternoon for an unknown reason. I have been in contact with our PECO representative to determine the reason for the outage on Wednesday.
3. Sunoco's Mariner II East project experienced damage to two temporary bridges during Hurricane Isais, which were being used to ferry equipment from Creek Road across the Brandywine into Upper Uwchlan Township. The parts of these bridges are still being removed from the banks of the Brandywine.

The larger issue occurred on Monday, August 10th, with an accidental release of approximately 10,000 gallons of drilling fluid into the Marsh Creek State Park Lake. Drilling fluid is a combination of bentonite, used to cool the drill bit and support the bore hole, and some type of proprietary fluids. While this material is not supposed to be toxic, the drilling fluid release could have a negative impact on aquatic life in the Lake.

The County Commissioners have asked for an independent, third-party agency to determine if this release would have any impact on residential wells near the State Park, or any residual impacts on public water supplies downstream, including the Downingtown Municipal Water Authority's intakes. DMWA does supply public water to the residents in the Tunbridge and Cumberland Ridge developments.

4. The Cohen Law Group continues to work on franchise renewal negotiations with Verizon. In spite of the pandemic, and numerous changes in the cable industry and federal regulations, good progress has been made. They expect to complete the negotiations fairly soon. Verizon has asked to phase delivery of the final franchise agreement packages. We should receive our agreement in the September-October timeframe.



Roadmaster Report to the Board of Supervisors for August 20, 2020

Culbertson Run Stormwater Improvements

The Culbertson Run stormwater improvements are continuing and are on schedule. Our contractor Eagle Construction has completed two of the underground basins and is starting on the third. Once this is completed they will be working on the swale restoration and grading along Hawthorne Drive. I want to thank all of the resident within the Culbertson Run/Hedgerow Development for their patients during construction. The residents have been disturbed for about three years, first with the replacement of the water main by AQUA, then tree removal by the Township Road Department and now with the stormwater work. The final piece of the puzzle will be the asphalt overlay. Later in the meeting I will ask the Board to accept the road bid.

Conversion from Florescent to LED

We are continuing to replace the florescent lights to LED throughout the Administration and Public Works buildings. This work is being completed by the Road Department as time permits. Most of the Administration end of the building is complete with the exception of the meeting room.

Road Department Manpower Shortage

This year has been a difficult time for the Road Department. We have been shorthanded most of the year. During the beginning of Covid we were limiting our hours until we got things in order such as social distancing, wearing masks, and cleaning of equipment and buildings. We had one of the crew miss two weeks due to an exposure to a confirmed Covid person. We currently have one of the crew out on disability due to a knee operation and last month Jimm Worrell retired after 12 years of service to the Township. We are currently assessing resumes for the Building Maintenance position. The Department has not taken on any large projects this year due to the shortage.

Hurricane Isaias

On Tuesday August 4th Hurricane Isaias hit East Brandywine Township. Although short lived it caused damage throughout the Township. Many trees were knocked down along with power lines, and roofs damage during the storm.

The Road Department was placed into service first closing Little Washington Road between North Guthriesville Road and Evergreen Drive. This area typically floods during a major rain event. We continued to clear trees on Township Roads if there were no wires involved. If a tree was on wires we closed both ends of the road. The following roads were closed: Osborne Road below Wooded Acres, Buck Road between Cumberland Ridge and Rock Raymond Road, North Buck Road between Spring Meadow and Batten Drive, Hopewell Road just west of Creek Road and Crawford Road between Hopewell and Creek Roads. Also a portion of Pancoast Lane east of Elston Drive was closed.

We worked with an Asplundh crew to remove a large tree on Osborne Road so power could be restored later in the evening by PECO. During the next few days we continued to monitor the roads, once PECO removed their wires we were able to clear the tree and re-open the roads. All Township owned roads were completely opened by Friday.

Re: Report from the Police Department / July 2020

1. COVID UPDATE – The Police Department has returned to normal scheduling operations. Officers and our staff are wearing masks at all times and we continue to practice social distancing guidelines while responding to calls. The business offices of the Police Department are still closed to walk in traffic.

If you have an **EMERGENCY DIAL 911 OR USE THE RED PHONE LOCATED ON THE WALL.**

If you have a **NON – EMERGENCY** complaint or need to speak to an Officer please call;

An officer will return your call as soon as possible.

2. The Police Department has purchased “WE SUPPORT OUR POLICE” signs for any resident or business that would like to display them at their residence or within their business. You can contact the Police Department for more information on how to obtain one.

3. The Police Department is working with Downingtown Community That Cares (CTC) to participate in a community event on-line auction to be held October 3-9, 2020. CTC and the Police Department are putting together an auction item that will involve a day at EBTPD for three youths. The day will consist of spending time with Officers throughout the day interviewing them, learning about policing and spending time in activities such as fingerprinting, photography, arrest processing, evidence collecting etc. Due to COVID the exact day and time still needs to be finalized. We are hoping that if this is successful that it will become an annual event with CTC.

4. Myself and the Police Chief’s from Downingtown Borough, Uwchlan, Upper Uwchlan and West Pikeland PD’s are in preliminary discussions with the Downingtown Area School District to participate in a program designed to promote better understanding and relations between black students and Police Officers. The original idea for this “connections” group was suggested by one of our residents. The

resident also works for the School District's STEM Academy. Due to COVID, the program is in the very early stages of discussion and I will forward more information as it becomes available.
