SUNDAY, APRIL 19 Downingtown & Lancaster Railroad

Historically, the East Brandywine and Waynesburg Railroad Company first connected the Pennsylvania Railroad (PRR) Main Line at Downingtown to Waynesburg (now Honey Brook), PA in November 1861. By December 1876, trackage extended west from Honey Brook to New Holland, PA. The railroad bordered East Brandywine until 1955. Come hear all about the D&L—nicknamed Dark & Lonely!

Please Do Not Disturb! Birdhouses in our Community Park

DURING NESTING SEASON, April through August, volunteer and bird watcher Marilyn Baiardi walks through Community Park monitoring the birdhouses that are in place for nesting of bluebirds, swallows, and wrens.

Nest box monitoring is done at specific times to ensure their conservation

and collect data to help increase their populations. “I only open boxes once a week, and keep detailed records of each box, so I have an idea of what is going on before checking inside,” shares Marilyn. “That way there is less chance of disturbing the natural course of events. Over monitoring will disrupt them, increase the possibility of abandonment and draw attention to predators.”

The time of day she checks is important so as not to disturb when the eggs typically hatch, when hatchlings are fed, or when the fledglings are ready to fledge. For 2019 Marilyn reported:

Our Community Park is a wonderful place to observe birds create nests, bring back food for their young, and fly around. Unfortunately, another activity observed last year was tampering with the boxes—including jamming of

branches into a box, trash placed in boxes, resting of sports equipment against the boxes, and actually opening boxes and leaving them open. Because of this tampering, Marilyn noted two flattened tree swallow eggs and missing eggs, most likely due to a predator who had easy access to open boxes.

“Tampering with the boxes will affect the mortality rate of the birds,” says Marilyn. “It is very important to not disturb the nesting boxes for their survival. Human interference can attract predators and/or cause abandonment of the eggs/hatchlings.”

As we approach nesting season, it is important to share this message with our community. If you see someone tampering with boxes, please ask them to stop. And do not place trash or equipment on or in the boxes.

Marilyn invites anyone interested in more information to feel free to stop her to chat when they see her monitoring boxes or contact Parks and Rec Board members to get in touch with her.

MULCH FOR SALE

For the tenth year, East Brandywine Township is selling double ground mulch. This mulch is from trees and brush collected and chipped along Township roads and from recycled Christmas Trees. There are no dyes or chemical additives in our mulch. It's strictly "green".

The cost of the mulch is \$15.00 per yard with a delivery charge of \$10.00 within the Township. Delivery is free for a full truckload (6 yards). You can make an appointment to pick up mulch at the Township Complex or order on line at our website. We have a limited quantity so buy your mulch early.

CHIPPING SERVICES

The Road Department is continuing our popular chipping service. Residents place their materials to be chipped at curbside. The service is free if it takes less than 15 minutes. The cost is \$25 for each additional 15-minute block. Additional trips are charged \$25 for 15-minute intervals. Please place cut ends facing the street for easier removal by the Department. Due to time restraints, we may limit the time spent chipping.

Historic Marker Dedication to Jim Croce

Ceremony on April 25 in Lyndell

JOIN THE PENNSYLVANIA Historical and Museum Commission and the East Brandywine Township Historical Commission along with State and Local Dignitaries on April 25 as they gather to dedicate a Historical Marker commemorating James "Jim" Croce. This event is free to everyone, but a printed ticket is required to board the shuttle buses.

Successful singer/songwriter Jim Croce's work rose to the top of national and international pop music charts for singles and albums in the 1970s. Jim Croce wrote many of his best-known songs during the time he and his family were living in East Brandywine Township.

When he moved here, Croce was disappointed with a career that had failed to launch. He was exhausted by lengthy music tours and frustrated by low pay and a deceptive music industry. He debated whether he should continue his efforts towards a successful music career. His breakout success as a national and international folk and rock music star is the result of 20 songs composed or completed during his 1970-1972 residence here. Lyndell's pleasant surroundings provided Jim Croce with the serenity and artistic inspiration that were critical in creating the turning point in his life and music career.

His songs have been covered by hundreds of performers. He is known as a folk storyteller, with such iconic hits as Time in a Bottle, Operator, I'll Have to Say I Love You in a Song, and Bad, Bad Leroy Brown. He was killed in a tragic plane crash at age 30.

The roadside marker will be dedicated on Saturday (April 25th) afternoon, and there will be a brief reception with refreshments served afterward. 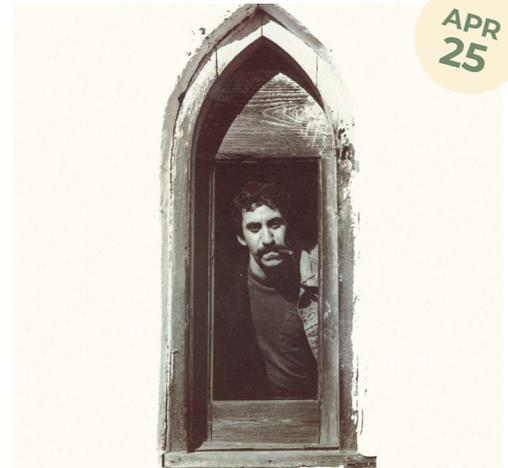

East Brandywine Township Police News

Officers now utilizing body-worn cameras

THE EAST BRANDYWINE Township Police Department has received a matching \$13,500 grant from the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), U.S. Department of Justice and the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) to implement a Body-Worn Camera (BWC) program in the Police Department.



Officer BWCs are relatively small devices that record interactions between community members (e.g. the public, suspects, and victims) and law enforcement officers. The video and audio recordings from BWCs can be used by law enforcement to demonstrate transparency to their communities. They are used to document statements, observations, and other evidence and to deter unprofessional, illegal and inappropriate behaviors by both law enforcement and the public.

The Police Department presently utilizes mobile-video recording systems in the Police vehicles. The BWCs are complementing the mobile-video systems by recording officer interactions once they leave the confines of the Police vehicle. Both the mobile and BWC systems can be used separately or together. In those cases that both mobile and BWC recordings exist, those files can be downloaded and merged into one digital evidence file.

The grant application and BWC policy development began in 2018 and the Police Department was notified in mid-2019 by BJA and PCCD that the grant application and BWC policies were approved. The final phase of the project occurred this past November with the training of all officers and on December 9 the BWC's were put into full service throughout the Department.

TRAILS COMMITTEE IS SEEKING NEW MEMBERS

The Trails Committee advises the Board of Supervisors regarding the development of trails throughout the Township. Current projects include the East-West Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail that will navigate through the Township from the Struble Trail at Dowlin Forge Road to Hibernia Park in West Brandywine, and various connector trails from nearby Township neighborhoods to the East Brandywine Community Park. An interest in contributing to the planning, designing and implementation of trails in the Township is required. A wide range of skills are welcome.
