## LEAVES ARE FALLING, BUT ...

OPEN BURNING IS PROHIBITED

Burning trash, recyclables, leaves, limbs, tree stumps or yard debris of any kind, whether in an open fire or in a barrel-type container, is strictly prohibited in the Township. This prohibition has been in effect since the Spring of 2012. The Township provides a wide range of services that make disposing of material by burning unnecessary:

- ▶ Weekly Curbside Collection of Trash and Recycling
- ▶ Monthly Curbside Bulk Trash Collection
- ▶ Six Curbside Yard Waste Collection dates per year
- ▶ Four Leaf Collection weeks per year
- ▶ A limited Wood Chipping Service performed by the Township (Public Works staff are available on request.)
- ▶ A Recycle Drop-Off Center
- ▶ Multiple Hazardous Household Waste Collection Events throughout the year
- ▶ An annual Shredding & E-Waste Recycling Event

**Fall 2024 Leaf Collection weeks are NOV 4-8, NOV 18-22, and DEC 2-6**



## Trail Connections

### New Sections of East-West Brandywine Trail Now Complete

**T**HE EAST BRANDYWINE Township Trails Committee is pleased to report that significant connections have been completed for the proposed East-West Brandywine Trail. The trail is a neighborhood connector trail used primarily by residents to walk, run, or bike for recreation and transportation. The East-West Brandywine Trail will eventually connect the Struble Trail to Hibernia County Park.

With these connections, Township residents can now walk/run/bike between the East Brandywine Park and the Applecross Trail via Wildbrier Drive and Firethorn Drive, through the Maplevue development, and crossing Route 322 at the Bollinger Road traffic light. On-road stripping and crosswalks are complete, and East-West Trail signage is coming soon.



The Trails Committee is in the process of securing funding to complete additional connections for this recreational trail. The East Brandywine Trails Committee is looking for additional members who are interested in advancing the trails network within the Township. Applicable experience is preferred but not required.



### Self Help Through Self Work

The Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School (DIAS)—a Legacy Upheld through the Mission of the Delaware Community College. We'll explore the history of the DIAS, a school for African Americans where they learned agriculture, mechanical trades, domestic arts, reading, writing, and mathematics for almost 90 years between 1904 and 1993. The college inherits the legacy of DIAS in providing a student-focused approach to quality educational programs and services to students of all backgrounds. *Presenter: Dr. Momodu C. ### Vera McEntire White (1888-1966): Artist and Collector

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, 3 PM


As the wife of Samuel S. White III, heir to the S. S. White Dental Manufacturing Company fortune, Vera McEntire White shaped one of the most important collections of Modern Art in the United States. The couple amassed over 300 objects, including works by Matisse, Picasso, Cézanne, Braque, and Brancusi, all of which were bequeathed to the Philadelphia Museum of Art in 1967. This talk examines White's own artistic practice and examines how her experience as an artist shaped the collection. *Presenter: Olivia Gruber Florek, PhD, Assoc. ## Chief's Corner

### ATTENTION VEHICLE OWNERS AND DRIVERS!



Even though these rules have been in effect for years, many vehicle owners and drivers do not follow the law. Please remember:

**Rule #1**—Your vehicle registration and inspection typically expire at different times. Pay attention to those expiration dates. The citations for failing to renew your registration or inspection are expensive.

**Rule # 2**—When all traffic lights are out at an intersection (due to a storm, etc.) ALL TRAFFIC MUST STOP at the intersection. Failure to stop at a non-working traffic signal can result in a citation.

# Ugh!! Solicitors! What is the Law?

**S**TARTING IN SPRING, we start to see those pests. I'm not talking about stink bugs, ants, or other flying pests. I'm talking about those proverbial SOLICITORS! Each year the EBTPD receives phone calls from residents asking us to remove them. That is easier said than done.

There are two types of solicitors. The first are those who do not need a Township Soliciting Permit. These include non-profit organizations, political or activist groups, and religious groups. Many, but not all, of these groups notify the Police that they are in the Township, but they are not required to.

The second group are your for-profit companies. The most popular in our Township are the bug guys, window and home improvement guys, and the ice cream man (we like him). These company individuals are required to complete soliciting applications and pay a permit fee. The Police Department completes a background check on each applicant, and only those passing the check receive a permit.

When permits are issued, each solicitor signs a release stating they understand the ordinance and the "Code of Conduct" section. Even so, it may still not be enough to keep them away from your residence. Why? Because your residence or private community needs to be properly posted "No Soliciting." Posting your

property can be done in various ways using doorbell stickers, window, garden, or driveway signs. The key is to make sure the sign is unobstructed and clearly visible.

If your notice of choice is a posted sign, be aware of the Township rules regarding signs. Under section 399-115.B of the Township's Peddling and Solicitation Ordinance, a "No Solicitation" sign is considered an "exempt sign" and permitted on your property (or within your HOA community) if the sign does not exceed four (4) square feet. An HOA community should post signs at all entrances to the community and at spots within the community. Consider posting your property if solicitors are a nuisance to you.

For policing purposes, the stickers and signs are the required notice to the solicitor that they are forbidden to solicit. Should we cite a solicitor, we will present their signature on the Township release, a picture of your posted warning, and your testimony, when presenting the case to the District Judge.

Solicitors will be back every year. If required, they must obtain a permit and always carry that permit with them. Solicitors cannot be threatening or rude and they must leave your property when asked to do so. When a residence or community is properly posted, a solicitor should not come onto the property.
